



LOOKING GLASS WINES



2008 Barossa Valley Grenache Shiraz Mourvedre

The weather during the 2008 Barossa Valley vintage was often particularly hot, with many vineyards producing spectacular sound fruit.

The vineyard parcels selected by Looking Glass for the 2008 BV GSM provided consistent, spicy, flavoursome and varietal fruit.

The Grenache was grown on Biscay soils, found in various parts of the valley.

The Shiraz comes from vineyards around Light Pass, and the Mourvedre (Mataro) from Belvedere Rd, in the northern Barossa.

The wine has been aged in 100 percent French oak, of which 35 per cent was new oak. The maturation was for 18 months.

The blend has created a fine, classic structure with a complexity of characters.

The wine shows a brilliant red purple colour, with intense berry fruit, and savoury and spice aromas. The palate is medium to full bodied, rich in the rustic varietal flavours and balanced, subtle oak.

Grenache 66%, Shiraz 30%, Mourvedre 4%.
